WHAT DOES ADVANTIS CREDIT UNION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us.

This information can include:

- Social Security number and account balances
- credit history and credit scores
- income and transaction history

How?

All financial companies need to share members' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their members' personal information; the reasons Advantis Credit Union chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do

How does Advantis Credit Union protect my personal information? To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer

safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does Advantis Credit Union collect my personal information? We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- open an account or apply for a loan
- show your government-issued ID or provide account information
- make deposits or withdrawals from your account

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State law and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?

Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- Our affiliates include financial companies, such as CUSO Financial Services, L.P. (Member FINRA/SIPC), our broker/dealer

Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and

nonfinancial companies.

- Nonaffiliates we share with can include insurance companies, government agencies, plastic card processors (credit/debit/ATM), financial statement publishers or printers, mailhouse, mortgage companies, mortgage service companies, consumer reporting agencies, data processors, and check/share draft printers

Joint Marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market

financial products or services to you.

- Our joint marketing partners include insurance services providers

MEMBERSHIP AND ACCOUNT AGREEMENT

This Agreement covers the rights and responsibilities concerning your accounts and the rights and responsibilities of Advantis Credit Union (credit union). In this Agreement, the words **you** and **yours** mean anyone who signs an Account Card or AccountChange Card (account card or any other account opening document). The words **we, us,** and **our** mean the Credit Union. The word **account** means any one (1) or more savings or other accounts you have with the credit union.

Your account type(s) and ownership features are designated on your Account Card. By signing an Account Card, each of you, jointly and severally, agree to the terms and conditions in this Agreement and Account Card, the Funds Availability Policy Disclosure, Truth-in-Savings Disclosure, Electronic Funds Transfer Agreement and Disclosure, Privacy Notice Disclosure, any Account Deposit Receipt accompanying this Agreement, the credit union's bylaws and policies, and any amendments to these documents from time to time which collectively govern your membership and accounts.

- MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY To join the credit union you must meet the membership requirements including purchase andmaintenance of the minimum required share(s) ("membership share") as set forth in the credit union's bylaws. You authorize us to check your account, credit, and employment history, and obtain reports from third parties, including credit reporting agencies, to verify your eligibility for the accounts and services you request.
- 2. Time periods for payment and maintenance of membership share. A member who fails to complete payment of one (1)membership share within 60 days of admission to membership, or within 60 days from the increase of the par value of membershipshares, or a member who reduces the membership share balance below the par value of one (1) membership share and does not increase the balance to at least the par value of one (1) share within 60 days of the reduction may be terminated from membershipand a fee charged.
- 1. INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS An individual account is an account owned by one (1) member (individual, corporation,partnership, trust or other organization) qualified for credit union membership. If the account owner dies, the interest passes, subject applicable law, to the account owner's estate or Payable on Death (POD) beneficiary/payee or trust beneficiary, subject to other provisions of this Agreement governing our protection for honoring transfer and withdrawal requests of an owner or owner's agent prior to notice of an owner's death and to any security interest or pledge granted by the account owner and subject to our statutory lien rights.
- 2. **JOINT ACCOUNTS** A joint account is an account owned by two (2) or more persons.

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- Rights of Survivorship. Unless otherwise stated on the Account Card, a joint account includes rights of survivorship. This means when one (1) owner dies, all sums in the account will pass to the surviving owner(s). For a joint account without rights of survivorship, the deceased owner's interest passes to his or her estate. A surviving owner's interest is subject to the credit union's statutory lien for the deceased owner's obligations, and to any security interest or pledge granted by a deceased owner, even if a surviving owner did not consent to it.
 - Control of Joint Accounts. Any owner is authorized and deemed to act for any other owner(s) and may instruct us regardingtransactions and other account matters. Each owner guarantees the signature of any other owner(s). Any owner may withdraw allfunds, stop payment on items, transfer, or pledge to us any part of the funds on deposit without the consent of the other owner(s). We have no duty to notify any owner(s) about any transaction. We reserve the right to require written consent of all owners for any change to or termination of an account. If we receive written notice of a dispute between owners or inconsistent instructions fromthem, we may suspend or terminate the account and require a court order or written consent from all owners to act.
 - **Joint Account Owner Liability.** If an item deposited in a joint account is returned unpaid, a joint account is overdrawn, or if wedo not receive final payment on a transaction, the owners, jointly and severally, are liable to us for the amount of the returned item, overdraft, or unpaid amount and any charges, regardless of who initiated or benefited from the transaction. If any account owner isindebted to us, we may enforce our rights against any account of the indebted owner, including all funds in the joint account regardless of who contributed the funds in the account.
 - 1. POD/TRUST ACCOUNT DESIGNATIONS A Payable on Death (POD) account or trust account designation is an instruction to the credit union that an individual or joint account so designated is payable to the owner(s) during his, her or their lifetimes and, when the last account owner dies, payable to all and surviving POD or trust beneficiaries/payees. If there is more than one (1)surviving beneficiary/payee, the account is owned jointly by such beneficiaries/payees without rights of survivorship upon the deathof the last account owner. Any POD or trust beneficiary/payee designation shall not apply to Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs). We are not obligated to notify any beneficiary/payee of the existence of any

account or the vesting of the beneficiary/payee sinterest in any account, except as otherwise provided by law. This paragraph does not apply to an account held on behalf of or heldin the name of a trust.

- 2. ACCOUNTS FOR MINORS We may require any account established by a minor to be a joint account with an owner whohas reached the age of majority under state law and who shall be jointly and severally liable to us for any returned item, overdraft, or unpaid charges or amounts on such account. We may pay funds directly to the minor without regard to his or her minority. Unless a guardian or parent is an account owner, the guardian or parent shall not have any account access rights. We have no duty toinquire about the use or purpose of any transaction. We will not change the account status when the minor reaches the age ofmajority unless authorized in writing by all account owners.
- 3. **UNIFORM TRANSFERS/GIFTS TO MINORS ACCOUNT** A Uniform Transfers/Gifts to Minors Account (UTMA/UGMA) is an individual account created by a custodian who deposits funds as an irrevocable gift to a minor. The minor to whom the gift is made is the beneficiary of the custodial property in the account. The custodian has possession and control of the account for the exclusive right and benefit of the minor and barring a court order otherwise, is the only party entitled to make deposits, withdrawals, or close the account. We have no duty to inquire about the use or purpose of any transaction. If the custodian dies, we may suspend theaccount until we receive instructions from any person authorized by law to withdraw funds or a court order authorizing withdrawal.
- 4. **AGENCY DESIGNATION ON AN ACCOUNT** An agency designation on an account is an instruction to us that the ownerauthorizes another person to make transactions as agent for the account owner regarding the accounts designated. An agent hasno ownership interest in the account(s) or credit union voting rights. We have no duty to inquire about the use or purpose of anytransaction made by the agent.
- 5. **DEPOSIT OF FUNDS REQUIREMENTS** Funds may be deposited to any account, in any manner approved by the credit union in accordance with the requirements as set forth in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure. Deposits made by mail, at night depositories or at unstaffed facilities are not our responsibility until we receive them. We reserve the right to refuse or to return any deposit.
- **Endorsements.** We may accept transfers, checks, and other items for deposit into any of your accounts if they are madepayable to, or to the order of, one (1) or more account owners even if they are not endorsed by all payees. You authorize us to supply missing endorsements of any owners if we choose. If a check or item that is payable to two (2) or more persons isambiguous as to whether it is payable to either or both, we may process the check or item as though it is payable to either person. If an insurance, government, or other check requires an endorsement, we may require endorsement as set forth on the item. Endorsements must be made on the back of the check within 1½ inches from the top edge, although we may accept endorsementsoutside this space. However, any loss we incur from a delay or processing error resulting from an irregular endorsement or other markings by you or any prior endorser will be your responsibility.
- Collection of Items. We act only as your agent and we are not responsible for handling items for deposit or collection beyond the exercise of ordinary care. We are not liable for the negligence of any correspondent or for loss in transit, and each correspondent will only be liable for its own negligence. We may send any item for collection. Items drawn on an institution located outside the United States are handled on a collection basis only. You waive any notice of nonpayment, dishonor, or protest regarding items we purchase or receive for credit or collection to your account. We reserve the right to pursue collection of previously dishonored items at any time, including giving a payor financial institution extra time beyond any midnight deadline limits.

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- **Restrictive Legends.** Some checks contain restrictive legends or similar limitations on the front of the item. Examples of restrictive legends include "two signatures required", "void after 60 days" or "not valid over \$500." We are not liable for payment of the contrary to a restrictive legend or other limitation contained in or on the item unless we have specifically agreed in writing to the restrictions or limitations.
- **Final Payment.** All items or Automated Clearing House (ACH) transfers credited to your account are provisional until wereceive final payment. If final payment is not received, we may charge your account for the amount of such items or ACH transfers and impose a return item charge on your account. Any collection fees we incur may be charged to your account. We reserve the right to refuse or return any item or funds transfer.
- **Direct Deposits.** We may offer preauthorized deposits (e.g., payroll checks, Social Security or retirement checks, or othergovernment checks) or preauthorized transfers from other accounts. You must authorize direct deposits or preauthorized transfers by filling out a separate form. You must notify us at least 30 days in advance to cancel or change a direct deposit or transfer option. If your account is overdrawn, you authorize us to deduct the amount your account is overdrawn from any deposit, including depositsof government payments or benefits. Upon a bankruptcy filing, unless you cancel the authorization, we will continue applyingpayments from direct deposits in accordance with your authorization on file with us. If we

are required to reimburse the U.S. Government for any benefit payment directly deposited into your account, we may deduct the amount returned from any of youraccounts, unless prohibited by law.

Crediting of Deposits. Deposits made after the deposit cut-off time and deposits made on either holidays or days that are notour business days will be credited to your account on the next business day.

9. ACCOUNT ACCESS —

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Authorized Signature. Your signature on the Account Card authorizes your account access. We will not be liable for refusingto honor any item or instruction if we believe the signature is not genuine. If you have authorized the use of a facsimile signature, wemay honor any check that appears to bear your facsimile signature even if it was made by an unauthorized person. You authorizeus to honor transactions initiated by a third person to whom you have given your account number even if you do not authorize a particular transaction.

Access Options. You may withdraw or transfer funds from your account(s) in any manner we permit (e.g., at an automatedteller machine, in person, by mail, Internet access, automatic transfer, or telephone, as applicable). We may return as unpaid any check drawn on a form we do not provide, and you are responsible for any loss we incur handling such a check. We have the rightto review and approve any form of power of attorney and may restrict account withdrawals or transfers. We are under no obligation to honor any power of attorney.

Credit Union Examination. We may disregard information on any check other than the signature of the drawer, the amount and any magnetic encoding. You agree we do not fail to exercise ordinary care in paying an item solely because our procedures do not provide for sight examination of items.

10. ACH & WIRE TRANSFERS — Except as amended by this Agreement, electronic funds transfers we permit that are subject to Article 4A of the Uniform Commercial Code will be subject to such provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code as enacted by the state where the main office of the credit union is located. We may execute certain requests for electronic funds transfers by Fedwire. Fedwire transactions are subject to Federal Reserve Board Regulation J. You may order electronic funds transfers to or from your account. We will debit your account for the amount of an electronic funds transfer and will charge your account for anyfees related to the transfer. Unless we agree otherwise in writing, we reserve the right to refuse to execute any order to transferfunds to or from your account. We are not obligated to execute any order to transfer funds out of your account if the amount of the requested transfer plus applicable fees exceeds the available funds in your account. We are not liable for errors, delays, interruptions or transmission failures caused by third parties or circumstances beyond our control including mechanical, electronic orequipment failure. We will not provide you with next day notice of ACH, wire transfers and other electronic payments credited to your account. You will receive notice of such credits on your account statements. You may contact us to determine whether a payment has been received. If we fail to properly execute a payment order, and such action results in a delay in payment to you, wewill pay you dividends or interest for the period of delay as required by applicable law. The dividends or interest paid to you will bebased on the lowest nominal dividend or interest rate we were paying on any account during that period. Payment orders weaccept will be executed within a reasonable time of receipt but may not necessarily be executed on the date they are received. Cutoff times may apply to the receipt, execution and processing of funds transfers, payment orders, cancellations, and amendments and if received after a cut-off time, may be treated as having been received on the next following funds transfer business day. Information about any cut-off times is available upon request. From time to time, we may need to suspend processing of a

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transaction for greater scrutiny or verification in accordance with applicable law, and this action may affect settlement or availability of the transaction. When you initiate a wire transfer, you may identify the recipient and any financial institution by name and byaccount or identifying number. The credit union and any other financial institutions facilitating the transfer may rely strictly on the account or identifying number even if the number identifies a different person or financial institution. Any account owner may amendor cancel a payment order even if that person did not initiate the order. We may refuse requests to amend or cancel a payment order that we believe will expose the credit union to liability or loss. Any request to amend or cancel a payment order that we acceptwill be processed within a reasonable time after it is received. You agree to hold us harmless from and indemnify us for all lossesand expenses resulting from any actual or attempted amendment or cancellation of a payment order. We may require you to follows security procedure to execute a payment order or certain electronic funds transfer transactions. We will notify you of any such security procedures and you agree that our security procedures are commercially reasonable.

 ACCOUNT RATES AND FEES — We pay account earnings and assess fees against your account as set forth in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges. We may change the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges at any time and will notify you as required by law.

2. TRANSACTION LIMITATIONS —

a. Withdrawal Restrictions. We will pay checks, permit withdrawals and make transfers from your account from available fundsin your account. The availability of funds in your account may be delayed as described in our Funds Availability Policy Disclosure. We may also pay checks, permit withdrawals and make transfers from your account from insufficient available funds if you have established an overdraft protection plan or, if you do not have such a plan with us, according to our overdraft payment policy.

We may refuse to allow a withdrawal in some situations, and will advise you accordingly: for example, (1) a dispute between account owners (unless a court has ordered the credit union to allow the withdrawal); (2) a legal garnishment or attachment isserved; (3) the account secures any obligation to us; (4) required documentation has not been presented; or (5) you fail to repay acredit union loan on time. We may require you to give written notice of seven (7) days to 60 days before any intended withdrawals.

- **b. Transfer Limitations.** We may limit the dollar amount or the number of transfers from your account. Please consult your Truthin-Savings Disclosure or your Electronic Funds Transfer Agreement and Disclosure.
 - CERTIFICATE ACCOUNTS Any time deposit, term share, share certificate, or certificate of deposit
 account allowed by statelaw (certificate account), whichever we offer, is subject to the terms of this
 Agreement, the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure and AccountDeposit Receipt for each account, the terms of
 which are incorporated herein by reference.

2. OVERDRAFTS —

a. Payment of Overdrafts. If, on any day, the available funds in your share or deposit account are not sufficient to pay the fullamount of a check, draft, transaction, or other item posted to your account plus any applicable fee ("overdraft"), we may pay orreturn the overdraft. The Credit Union's determination of an insufficient available account balance may be made at any timebetween presentation and the Credit Union's midnight deadline with only one (1) review of the account required. We do not have to notify you if your account does not have sufficient available funds to pay an overdraft. Your account may be subject to a charge foreach overdraft regardless of whether we pay or return the overdraft. For ATM and one-time debit transactions, you must consent to the Credit Union's overdraft protection plan in order for the transaction amount to be covered under the plan. Without your consent, the Credit Union may not authorize and pay an overdraft resulting from these types of transactions. Services and fees for overdrafts are shown in the document the Credit Union uses to capture the member's optin choice for overdraft protection and the Scheduleof Fees and Charges.

Except as otherwise agreed in writing, if we exercise our right to use our discretion to pay an overdraft, we do not agree to payoverdrafts in the future and may discontinue covering overdrafts at any time without notice. If we pay an overdraft or impose a fee that overdraws your account, you agree to pay the overdrawn amount in accordance with your overdraft protection plan or, if you do not have such a plan with us, in accordance with our overdraft payment policy.

- **b. Order of Payment.** Checks, items and other transactions may not be processed in the order that you make them or in the order that we receive them. We may, at our discretion, pay a check, or item and execute other transactions on your account in anyorder we choose. The order in which we process checks, and item and execute other transactions on your account may affect the total amount of overdraft fees that may be charged to your account. Please contact us if you have questions about how we pay checks and process transfers and withdrawals.
 - 1. POSTDATED AND STALEDATED CHECKS You agree not to issue any check that is postdated. If you do issue a checkthat is payable on a future date and we pay it before that date, you agree that we shall have no liability to you for such payment. You agree not to deposit checks or other items before they are properly payable. We are not obligated to pay any check drawn onyour account that is presented more than six (6) months past its date.

2. STOP PAYMENT ORDERS —

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- Stop Payment Order Request. Any owner may request a stop payment order on any check drawn on the owner's account. Stop payment orders may be made orally or in writing, by the member (primary account owner) or joint account owner. To bebinding, the stop payment order must accurately describe the check including the exact account number, check number and theexact amount of the check. This exact information is necessary for the credit union's computer to identify the check. We will sendyou a confirmation of your stop payment order. You must notify us immediately if it is not accurate. In addition, we must receive sufficient advance notice of the stop payment order to allow us a reasonable opportunity for us to act on it. If we recredit youraccount after paying a check over a valid and timely stop payment order, you agree to sign a statement describing the dispute withthe payee, to assign to us all of your rights against the payee or other holders of the check and to assist us in any legal action.
 - **Duration of Order.** Oral stop payment orders for checks or drafts will lapse within 14 calendar days unless confirmed in writing within that time. Written stop payment orders for checks or drafts are effective for six (6) months and may be renewed for additional six (6) month periods by requesting in writing that the stop payment order be renewed within a period during which the stop payment order is effective. We are not

required to notify you when a stop payment order expires.

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- Liability. Fees for stop payment orders are set forth in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges. Youmay not stop payment on any certified check, cashier's check, teller's check, or any other check or payment guaranteed by us. Although payment of an item may be stopped, you may remain liable to any item holder, including us. You agree to indemnify andhold the credit union harmless from all costs, including attorney's fees, damages or claims related to our refusing payment of an item, including claims of any joint account owner, payee, or endorsee in failing to stop payment of an item as a result of incorrectinformation provided by you.
- **17. CREDIT UNION LIABILITY** If we do not properly complete a transaction according to this Agreement, we will be liable for your losses or damages not to exceed the amount of the transaction, except as otherwise provided by law. We will not be liable if:
- (1) your account contains insufficient funds for the transaction; (2) circumstances beyond our control prevent the transaction; (3)your loss is caused by your or another financial institution's negligence; or (4) your account funds are subject to legal process or other claim. We will not be liable for consequential damages, except liability for wrongful dishonor. We exercise ordinary care if our actions or non-actions are consistent with applicable state law, Federal Reserve regulations and operating letters, clearinghouse rules, and general financial institution practices followed in the area we serve. You grant us the right, in making payments ofdeposited funds, to rely exclusively on the form of the account and the terms of this Agreement. Any conflict between what you orour employees may say or write will be resolved by reference to this Agreement.
 - 1. **CHECKS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT IN PERSON** We may refuse to accept any check drawn on your account that ispresented for payment in person. Such refusal shall not constitute a wrongful dishonor of the check and we shall have no liability forrefusing payment.
 - 2. REMOTELY CREATED CHECKS For purposes of this paragraph, "account" means a transaction account, credit account, and any other account on which checks (share drafts) may be drawn. A remotely created check is a check created by someone other than the person on whose account the check is drawn. A remotely created check is generally created by a third party payeeas authorized by the owner of the account on which the check is drawn. Authorization is usually made over the telephone or throughon-line communication. The owner of the account does not sign a remotely created check. In place of the owner's signature, the remotely created check usually bears a statement that the owner authorized the check or bears the owner's printed or typed name. If you authorize a third party to draw a remotely created check against your account, you may not later revoke your authorization. It is your responsibility to resolve any authorization issues directly with the third party. We are not required to credit your account andmay charge against your account any remotely created check for which the third party has proof of your authorization.
 - 1. PLEDGE/STATUTORY LIEN Unless prohibited by law, you pledge and grant as security for all obligations you may havenow or in the future, except obligations secured by your principal residence, all savings and dividends and all deposits and interest, if any, in all accounts you have with us now and in the future. If you pledge a specific dollar amount in your account for a loan, wewill freeze the funds in your account(s) to the extent of the outstanding balance of the loan or, if greater, the amount of the pledge if the loan is a revolving loan. Otherwise, funds in your pledged account(s) may be withdrawn unless you are in default. State lawgives us a lien on all savings and interest and all deposits and interest, if any, in accounts you have with us now and in the future. Except as limited by state law, the statutory lien gives us the right to apply the balance of all your accounts to any obligation onwhich you are in default. After you are in default, we may exercise our statutory lien rights without further notice to you.
 - 2. Your pledge and our statutory lien rights will allow us to apply the funds in your account to what you owe when you are indefault, except as limited by state or federal law. If we do not apply the funds in your account(s) to satisfy your obligation, wemay place an administrative freeze on your account(s) in order to protect our statutory lien rights and may apply the funds in your account(s) to the amount you owe us at a later time. The statutory lien and your pledge do not apply to any Individual Retirement Account or any other account that would lose special tax treatment under state or federal law if given as security. By not enforcing our right to apply funds in your account to your obligations that are in default, we do not waive our right to enforce these rights at a later time.
 - 3. **LEGAL PROCESS** If any legal action is brought against your account, we may pay out funds according to the terms of theaction or refuse any payout until the dispute is resolved. Any expenses or attorney fees we incur responding to legal process may be charged against your account without notice, unless prohibited by law. Any legal process against your account is subject to ourlien and security interest.
 - 4. **ACCOUNT INFORMATION** Upon request, we will give you the name and address of each agency from which we obtain acredit report regarding your account. We agree not to disclose account information to third parties except when: (1) it is necessaryto complete a transaction; (2) the third party seeks to verify the existence or condition of your account in accordance with applicable law; (3) such disclosure complies with the law or a government agency or court order; or (4) you give us written permission.

5. NOTICES —

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- Name or Address Changes. You are responsible for notifying us of any address or name change. The credit union is onlyrequired to attempt to communicate with you at the most recent address you have provided to us. We may require all names andaddress changes to be provided in writing. If we attempt to locate you, we may impose a service fee as set forth in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges.
- b. Notice of Amendments. Except as prohibited by applicable law, we may change the terms of this Agreement. We will notifyyou of any changes in terms, rates, or fees as required by law. We reserve the right to waive any term in this Agreement. Any suchwaiver shall not affect our right to future enforcement.
- **Effect of Notice.** Any written notice you give us is effective when we receive it. Any written notice we give to you is effectivewhen it is deposited in the U.S. mail, postage prepaid and addressed to you at your statement mailing address. Notice to any account owner is considered notice to all account owners.
- d. Electronic Notices. If you have agreed to receive notices electronically, we may send you notices electronically and discontinue mailing paper notices to you until you notify us that you wish to reinstate receiving paper notices.
 - TAXPAYER IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS AND BACKUP WITHHOLDING Your failure to furnish a
 correct TaxpayerIdentification Number (TIN) or meet other requirements may result in backup withholding.
 If your account is subject to backupwithholding, we must withhold and pay to the Internal Revenue Service
 (IRS) a percentage of dividends, interest, and certain other payments. If you fail to provide your TIN, we
 may suspend opening your account.

2. STATEMENTS —

- Contents. If we provide a periodic statement for your account, you will receive a periodic statement of transactions and activityon your account during the statement period as required by applicable law. If a periodic statement is provided, you agree that only one (1) statement is necessary for joint accounts. For checking accounts, you understand and agree that your original check, whenpaid, becomes property of the credit union and may not be returned to you, but copies may be retained by us or be payable through financial institutions and made available upon your request. You understand and agree that statements are made available to youon the date they are sent to you. You also understand and agree that checks or copies thereof are made available to you on thedate the statement is sent to you, even if the checks do not accompany the statement.
- **Examination.** You are responsible for promptly examining each statement upon receiving it and reporting any irregularities to us. If you fail to report any irregularities such as forged, altered, unauthorized, unsigned, or otherwise fraudulent items drawn onyour account, erroneous payments or transactions, or other discrepancies reflected on your statement within thirty (30) days ofreceiving your statement, we will not be responsible for your loss. In addition, we will not be responsible for any such items,payments, transactions or other discrepancies reflected on your statement if you fail to notify us within thirty-three (33) days of the mailing date of the statement. We also will not be liable for any items that are forged or altered in a manner not detectable by areasonable person, including the unauthorized use of a facsimile signature machine.
- Notice to Credit Union. You agree that the credit union's retention of checks does not alter or waive your responsibility toexamine your statements or the time limit for notifying us of any errors. The statement will be considered correct for all purposesand we will not be liable for any payment made or charge to your account unless you notify us in writing within the above time limit for notifying us of any errors. If you fail to receive a periodic statement, you agree to notify us within fourteen (14) days of the timeyou regularly receive a statement.

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1. INACTIVE ACCOUNTS — If your account falls below any applicable minimum balance and you have not made any transactions over a period specified in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges, we may classify youraccount as inactive or dormant. Unless prohibited by applicable law, we may charge a service fee as set forth in the Truth-in-Savings Disclosure or Schedule of Fees and Charges for processing your inactive account. If we impose a fee, we will notify you, as required by law, at your last known address. You authorize us to transfer funds from another account of yours to cover any servicefees, if applicable. To the extent allowed by law, we reserve the right to transfer the account funds to an account payable and to suspend any further account statements. If a deposit or withdrawal has not been made on the account and we have had no othersufficient contact with you within the period specified by state law, the account will be presumed to be abandoned. Funds inabandoned accounts will be reported and remitted in accordance with state law. Once funds have been turned over to the state, we have no further

liability to you for such funds and if you choose to reclaim such funds, you must apply to the appropriate state agency.

- 2. SPECIAL ACCOUNT INSTRUCTIONS You may request that we facilitate certain trust, will, or court-ordered account arrangements. However, because we do not give legal advice, we cannot counsel you as to which account arrangement mostappropriately meets the specific requirements of your trust, will, or court order. If you ask us to follow any instructions that webelieve might expose us to claims, lawsuits, expenses, liabilities, or damages, whether directly or indirectly, we may refuse to followyour instructions or may require you to indemnify us or post a bond or provide us with other protection. Account changes requested by you, or any account owner, such as adding or closing an account or service, must be evidenced by a signed Account ChangeCard and accepted by us.
- 3. **TERMINATION OF ACCOUNT** We may terminate your account at any time without notice to you or may require you toclose your account and apply for a new account if: (1) there is a change in owners or authorized signers; (2) there has been aforgery or fraud reported or committed involving your account; (3) there is a dispute as to the ownership of the account or of the funds in the account; (4) any checks are lost or stolen; (5) there are excessive returned unpaid items not covered by an overdraftprotection plan; (6) there has been any misrepresentation or any other abuse of any of your accounts; or (7) we reasonably deem itnecessary to prevent a loss to us. You may terminate an account by giving us notice. We reserve the right to require that such notice be in writing. Only the member (primary account owner) of a joint account may terminate a joint account. We are not responsible for payment of any check, withdrawal or other item after your account is terminated; however, if we pay an item after termination, you agree to reimburse us.
- 4. **TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP** You may terminate your membership by giving us written notice or by withdrawing yourminimum required membership share, if any, and closing all your accounts. You may be denied services and expelled frommembership for causing a loss to the credit union or you may be expelled for any reason as allowed by applicable law.
- 5. **DEATH OF ACCOUNT OWNER** We may continue to honor all transfer orders, withdrawals, deposits and other transactions on an account until we know of a member's death. Once we know of a member's death, we may pay checks or honor otherpayments or transfer orders authorized by the deceased member for a period of ten (10) days after that date unless we receiveinstructions from any person claiming an interest in the account to stop payment on the checks or other items. We may requireanyone claiming a deceased owner's account funds to indemnify us for any losses resulting from our honoring that claim. This Agreement will be binding upon any heirs or legal representatives of any account owner.
- 6. UNLAWFUL INTERNET GAMBLING AND OTHER ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES You agree that you are not engaged in unlawful Internet gambling or any other illegal activity. You agree that you will not use any of your accounts, access devices or services forunlawful Internet gambling or other illegal activities. We may terminate your account relationship if you engage in unlawful Internet gambling or other illegal activities.
- 7. **SEVERABILITY** If a court holds any portion of this Agreement to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be invalid or unenforceable and will continue in full force and effect. All headings are intended for referenceonly and are not to be construed as part of the Agreement.
- 8. ENFORCEMENT —
- a. Liability. You are liable to us for any losses, costs or expenses we incur resulting from your failure to follow this Agreement. You authorize us to deduct any such losses, costs or expenses from your account without prior notice to you. If we bring a legal action to collect any amount due under or to enforce this Agreement, we shall be entitled, subject to applicable law, to payment ofreasonable attorney's fees and costs, including fees on any appeal, bankruptcy proceedings, and any post-judgment collectionactions.
- b. Losses Due to Criminal Activity. To protect you and all other members of the credit union from a crime or potential crime on accounts, loans and all other products or services, we may require you to file a police report. We may deny services, up to and including closing your membership, if the credit union incurs a loss on one or more of your accounts due to criminal activity and you decline to file a police report.
 - GOVERNING LAW This Agreement is governed by the credit union's bylaws, federal laws and regulations, the laws,including applicable principles of contract law, and regulations of the state in which the credit union's main office is located, and local clearinghouse rules, as amended from time to time. As permitted by applicable law, you agree that any legal action regarding this Agreement shall be brought in the county in which the credit union is located.
 - 2. **NEGATIVE INFORMATION NOTICE** We may report information about your loan, share or deposit accounts to creditbureaus. Late payments, missed payments, or other defaults on your accounts may be reflected in your credit report.

FUNDS AVAILABILITY POLICY DISCLOSURE

This Disclosure describes your ability to withdraw funds at Advantis Credit Union. It only applies to the availability of funds in transaction accounts. The Credit Union reserves the right to delay the availability of funds deposited to accounts that are not transaction accounts for periods longer than those disclosed in this policy. Please ask us if you have a question about which accounts are affected by this policy.

- 1. **GENERAL POLICY** Our policy is to delay the availability of funds from your cash and check deposits. During the delay, you may not withdraw the funds in cash and we will not use the funds to pay checks that you have written.
- 2. **DETERMINING THE AVAILABILITY OF A DEPOSIT** When we delay the availability of a deposit the length of the delay is determined by counting the business days from the day of your deposit. Every day is a business day except Saturdays, Sundays and federal holidays. If you make a deposit before close of business (3:00 p.m. at a Night Depository) on a business day that we are open, we will consider that day to be the day of your deposit. However we will consider deposits made after close of business (3:00 pm at a Night Depository) or on a day that we are not open as deposited on the next business day we are open.

(If you make a deposit to an ATM that we own or operate before close of business, on a business day that we are open, we will consider that day to be the day of your deposit. However we will consider deposits to an ATM that we own or operate made after close of business, or on a day that we are not open as deposited on the next business day we are open.)

The length of the delay varies depending on the type of deposit and is explained below.

- 1. **SAME-DAY AVAILABILITY** Funds from electronic direct deposits to your account and cash (U.S. dollars) deposited in person to a credit union employee will be available on the same business day that we receive the deposit.
 - 1. **NEXT-DAY AVAILABILITY** Funds from the following deposits are available by the first business day after the day of your deposit:
 - U.S. Treasury checks that are payable to you
 - · Wire transfers
 - Checks drawn on Advantis Credit Union
 - 1. **NEXT-DAY AVAILABILITY FOR CERTAIN DEPOSITS MADE IN PERSON** Funds from the following deposits are available by the first business day after the day we receive your deposit, if you make the deposit in person to one of our employees:
 - State and local government checks that are payable to you
 - Cashier's, certified, and teller's checks that are payable to you
 - Federal Reserve Bank checks, Federal Home Loan Bank checks, and postal money orders, if these items are payable to you

If you do not make your deposit in person to one of our employees (for example, if you mail the deposit), funds from these deposits will be available by the second business day after the day we receive your deposit.

- 1. **AVAILABILITY OF OTHER CHECK DEPOSITS** The first \$200.00 from a deposit of checks will be available by the first business day after the day of your deposit. The remaining funds will be available by the second business day after the day of your deposit. For example, if you deposit a check of \$700.00 on a Monday, \$200.00 of the deposit will be available by Tuesday. The remaining \$500.00 will be available by Wednesday.
- 2. HOLDS ON OTHER FUNDS If we cash a check for you that is drawn on another financial institution, we may withhold the availability of a corresponding amount of funds that are already in your account. Those funds will be available at the time funds from the check we cashed would have been available if you had deposited it. If we accept for deposit a check that is drawn on another financial institution, we may make funds from the deposit available for withdrawal immediately but delay your availability to withdraw a corresponding amount of funds that you have on deposit in another account with us. The funds in the other account would then not be available for withdrawal until the time periods that are described elsewhere in this Disclosure for the type of check that you deposited.
 - 1. **LONGER DELAYS MAY APPLY** We may delay your ability to withdraw funds deposited by check into your account an additional number of days for these reasons:

- We believe a check you deposit will not be paid.
- You deposit checks totaling more than \$5,000.00 on any one (1) day.
- You deposit a check that has been returned unpaid.
- You have overdrawn your account repeatedly in the last six (6) months.
- There is an emergency, such as failure of communications or computer equipment.

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We will notify you if we delay your ability to withdraw funds for any of these reasons and we will tell you when the funds will be available. They will generally be available no later than the seventh business day after the day of your deposit.

- 1. **SPECIAL RULES FOR NEW ACCOUNTS** If you are a new member, the following special rules will apply during the first 30 days your account is open.
- 2. Funds from electronic direct deposits to your account will be available on the day we receive the deposit. Funds from deposits of cash, wire transfers, and the first \$5,000.00 of a day's total deposits of cashier's, certified, teller's, traveler's, and federal, state, and local government checks will be available on the next business day after the day of your deposit if the deposit meets certain conditions. For example, the checks must be payable to you. The excess over \$5,000.00 will be available on the ninth business day after the day of your deposit. If your deposit of these checks (other than a U.S. Treasury check) is not made in person to one of our employees, the first \$5,000.00 will not be available until the second business day after the day of your deposit. Funds from all other check deposits will be available on the thirtieth business day after the day of your deposit.
- 1. **DEPOSITS AT NONPROPRIETARY ATMS** Funds from any deposits (cash or checks) made at automated teller machines (ATMs) we do not own or operate will not be available until the fifth business day after the date of your deposit. This rule does not apply at ATMs that we own or operate. All ATMs that we own or operate are identified as our machines.
- 2. FOREIGN CHECKS Checks drawn on financial institutions located outside the U.S. (foreign checks) cannot be processed the same as checks drawn on U.S. financial institutions. Foreign checks are exempt from the policies outlined in this disclosure. Generally, the availability of funds for deposits of foreign checks will be delayed for the time it takes us to collect the funds from the financial institutions upon which it is drawn.

ELECTRONIC FUND TRANSFERS AGREEMENT AND DISCLOSURE

This Electronic Fund Transfers Agreement and Disclosure is the contract which covers your and our rights and responsibilities concerning the electronic fund transfers (EFT) services offered to you by Advantis Credit Union ("Credit Union"). In this Agreement, the words "you," "your," and "yours" mean those who sign the application or account card as applicants, joint owners, or any authorized users. The words "we," "us," and "our" mean the Credit Union. The word "account" means any one (1) or more savings, checking, and Money Market accounts you have with the Credit Union. Electronic fund transfers are electronically initiated transfers of money from your account through the EFT services described below. By signing an application or account card for EFT services, signing your card, or using any service, each of you, jointly and severally, agree to the terms and conditions in this Agreement and any amendments for the EFT services offered. Furthermore, electronic fund transfers that meet the definition of remittance transfers are governed by 12 C.F.R. part 1005, subpart B—Requirements for remittance transfers, and consequently, terms of this agreement may vary for those types of transactions. A "remittance transfer" is an electronic transfer of funds of more than \$15.00 requested by a sender to a designated recipient in a foreign country that is sent by a remittance transfer provider. Terms applicable to such transactions may vary from those disclosed herein and will be disclosed to you at the time such services are requested and rendered in accordance with applicable law.

- **1.EFT SERVICES** If approved, you may conduct any one (1) or more of the EFT services offered by the Credit Union.
- **a. ATM Card.** If approved, you may use your card and personal identification number (PIN) in automated teller machines (ATMs) of the Credit Union, Co-Op, PLUS, STAR networks, and such other machines or facilities as the Credit Union may designate. For ATM transactions, you must consent to the Credit Union's overdraft protection plan in order for the transaction amount to be covered under the plan. Without your consent, the Credit Union may not authorize and pay an overdraft resulting from this type of transaction. Services and fees for ATM overdrafts are shown in the document the Credit Union uses to capture the member's opt-in choice for overdraft protection and the Schedule of Fees and Charges.

At the present time, you may use your card to:

• Make deposits to your regular savings and checking accounts.

- Withdraw funds from your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Transfer funds from your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Obtain balance information for your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Make loan payments from your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Make point-of-sale (POS) transactions with your card and personal identification number (PIN) to purchase goods or services at POS terminals that carry STAR network logo(s).

The following limitations on ATM Card transactions may apply:

- You may make 30 cash withdrawals in any one (1) day.
- You may withdraw up to a maximum of \$510 in any one (1) day, if there are sufficient funds in your account.
- You may make 30 POS transactions in any one (1) day.
- You may purchase up to a maximum of \$2,500 from POS terminals per day, if there are sufficient funds in your account.
- For security purposes, there are other limits on the frequency and amount of transfers available at ATMs.
- You may transfer up to the available balance in your accounts at the time of the transfer.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.

Because of the servicing schedule and processing time required in ATM operations, there may be a delay between the time a deposit (either cash or check) is made and when it will be available for withdrawal.

b. Visa Check Card. If approved, you may use your card to purchase goods and services from participating merchants. If you wish to pay for goods or services over the Internet, you may be required to provide card number security information before you will be permitted to complete the transaction. You agree that you will not use your card for any transaction that is illegal under applicable federal, state, or local law. Funds to cover your card purchases will be deducted from your share draft account. For one-time debit transactions, you must consent to the Credit Union's overdraft protection plan in order for the transaction amount to be covered under the plan. Without your consent, the Credit Union may not authorize and pay an overdraft resulting from these types of transaction. Services and fees for overdrafts are shown in the document the Credit Union uses to capture the member's opt-in choice for overdraft protection and the Schedule of Fees and Charges.

For other types of transactions, if the balance in your account is not sufficient to pay the transaction amount, the Credit Union may pay the amount and treat the transaction as a request to transfer funds from other deposit accounts, approved overdraft protection accounts, or loan accounts that you have established with the Credit Union. If you initiate a transaction that overdraws your account, you agree to make immediate payment of any overdrafts together with any service charges to the Credit Union. In the event of repeated overdrafts, the Credit Union may terminate all services under this Agreement. You may use your card and personal identification number (PIN) in ATMs of the Credit Union, Co-Op, PLUS and STAR networks, and such other machines or facilities as

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the Credit Union may designate. In addition, you may use your card without a PIN for certain transactions on the Visa, Co-Op and STAR networks. However, provisions of this Agreement relating to Visa transactions do not apply to transactions processed through non-Visa networks. To initiate a Visa Debit transaction, you may sign a receipt, provide a card number or swipe your card through a point-of-sale (POS) terminal and choose to route the transaction over a Visa network. Please refer to the Member Liability section of this Agreement for terms and conditions.

At the present time, you may also use your card to:

- Make deposits to your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Withdraw funds from your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Transfer funds from your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Obtain balance information for your regular savings and checking accounts.
- Make loan payments from your regular savings and checking accounts.

- Make point-of-sale (POS) transactions with your card and personal identification number (PIN) to purchase goods or services at merchants that accept Visa.
- Order goods or services by mail or telephone from places that accept Visa.

The following limitations on Visa Check Card transactions may apply:

- You may make 30 Visa Check Card purchases per day.
- You may purchase up to a maximum of \$9,999 per day.
- You may make 30 cash withdrawals in any one (1) day from an ATM machine.
- You may withdraw up to a maximum of \$510 in any one (1) day from an ATM machine, if there are sufficient funds in your account.
- You may make 30 POS transactions in any one (1) day.
- You may purchase up to a maximum of \$2,500 from POS terminals per day, if there are sufficient funds in your account.
- For security purposes, there are other limits on the frequency and amount of transfers available at ATMs.
- You may transfer up to the available balance in your accounts at the time of the transfer.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.
- **c. Marty (Audio Response).** If we approve Marty (Audio Response) for your accounts, a separate personal identification number (PIN) will be assigned to you. You must use your personal identification number (PIN) along with your account number to access your accounts. At the present time, you may use Marty (Audio Response) to:
 - · Withdraw funds from your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Transfer funds from your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Obtain balance information for your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Make loan payments from your savings, checking, and Money Market accounts.
 - · Access your Personal Line of Credit and Visa account.
 - Determine if a particular item has cleared.
 - Obtain tax information on amounts earned on savings, checking, and Money Market accounts or interest paid on loan accounts.
 - Verify the last date and amount of your payroll deposit.
 - Obtain information about your loans such as balance due, payment amount or next due date.

Your accounts can be accessed under Marty (Audio Response) via a touch-tone telephone only. Marty (Audio Response) service will be available for your convenience 24 hours per day. This service may be interrupted for a short time each day for data processing.

The following limitations on Marty (Audio Response) transactions may apply:

- There is no limit to the number of inquiries, transfers, or withdrawal requests you may make in any one (1) day.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.

The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse any transaction which would draw upon insufficient funds, exceed a credit limit, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve on the account. All checks are payable to you as a primary member and will be mailed to your address of record. The Credit Union may set other limits on the amount of any transaction, and you will be notified of those limits. The Credit Union may refuse to honor any transaction for which you do not have sufficient available verified funds. The service will discontinue if no transaction is entered after numerous unsuccessful attempts to enter a transaction and there may be limits on the duration of each telephone call.

d. Preauthorized EFTs.

• Direct Deposit. Upon instruction of (i) your employer, (ii) the Treasury Department or (iii) other financial

institutions, the Credit Union will accept direct deposits of your paycheck or rederal recurring payments, such as Social Security, to your savings and/or checking account.

- **Preauthorized Debits.** Upon instruction, we will pay certain recurring transactions from your savings and checking accounts.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.
- Stop Payment Rights. If you have arranged in advance to make electronic fund transfers out of your account(s) for money you owe others, you may stop payment on preauthorized transfers from your account. You must notify us orally or in writing

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at any time up to three (3) business days before the scheduled date of the transfer. We may require written confirmation of the stop payment order to be made within 14 days of any oral notification. If we do not receive the written confirmation, the oral stop payment order shall cease to be binding 14 days after it has been made. A stop payment request for preauthorized Electronic Fund Transfers will apply to all subsequent transfers, unless you withdraw the request.

- Notice of Varying Amounts. If these regular payments may vary in amount, the person you are going to pay is required to tell you, ten (10) days before each payment, when it will be made and how much it will be. You may choose instead to get this notice only when the payment would differ by more than a certain amount from the previous payment or when the amount would fall outside certain limits that you set.
- Liability for Failure to Stop Payment of Preauthorized Transfers. If you order us to stop payment of a preauthorized transfer three (3) business days or more before the transfer is scheduled and we do not do so, we will be liable for your losses or damages.
- Electronic Check Conversion/Electronic Returned Check Fees. If you pay for purchases or bills with a check or draft, you may authorize your check or draft to be converted to an electronic fund transfer. You may also authorize merchants or other payees to electronically debit your account for returned check fees. You are considered to have authorized these electronic fund transfers if you complete the transaction after being told (orally or by a notice posted or sent to you) that the transfer may be processed electronically or if you sign a written authorization.
- f. Online Banking. If we approve Online Banking for your accounts, a separate personal identification number (PIN) will be assigned to you. You must use your personal identification number (PIN) along with your account number to access your accounts. At the present time, you may use Online Banking to:
 - Withdraw funds from your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Transfer funds from your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Obtain balance information for your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Make loan payments from your checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Access your Personal Line of Credit and Visa accounts.
 - Determine if a particular item has cleared.
 - Obtain tax information on amounts earned on savings, checking, and Money Market accounts or interest paid on loan accounts.
 - Verify the last date and amount of your payroll deposit.
 - Make bill payments to preauthorized creditors.
 - · Obtain transaction history on all credit union accounts.
 - Obtain information about your loans such as balance due, payment amount or next due date.
 - Communicate with the credit union using the electronic mail (email) feature.
 - · Receive your statements and other notices electronically.

Your accounts can be accessed under Online Banking via personal computer. Online Banking will be available for your convenience 24 hours per day. This service may be interrupted for a short time each day for data processing. We reserve the right to refuse any transaction which would draw upon insufficient funds, exceed a credit limit, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve

on the account. All checks are payable to you as a primary member and will be mailed to your address of record. We may set other limits on the amount of any transaction, and you will be notified of those limits. We may refuse to honor any transaction for which you do not have sufficient available verified funds. The service will discontinue if no transaction is entered after numerous unsuccessful attempts to enter a transaction and there may be limits on the duration of each access.

The following limitations on Online Banking transactions may apply:

- There is no limit to the number of inquiries, transfers, or withdrawal requests you may make in any one (1) day.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.
- **g. Mobile Banking.** If we approve Mobile Banking for your accounts, a separate personal identification number (PIN) will be assigned to you. You must use your personal identification number (PIN) along with your account number to access your accounts. At the present time, you may use Mobile Banking to:
 - Transfer funds from your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Obtain balance information for your savings, checking, loan, and Money Market accounts.
 - Make loan payments from your savings, checking, and Money Market accounts.
 - · Access your Personal Line of Credit, HELOC and Visa accounts.
 - Determine if a particular item has cleared.
 - Verify the last date and amount of your payroll deposit.
 - Make bill payments to preauthorized creditors.

Your accounts can be accessed under Mobile Banking via mobile device or other approved access device(s). Mobile Banking will be available for your convenience 24 hours per day. This service may be interrupted for a short time each day for data processing. We reserve the right to refuse any transaction which would draw upon insufficient funds, exceed a credit limit, lower an account below a required balance, or otherwise require us to increase our required reserve on the account. We may set other limits on the amount of any transaction, and you will be notified of those limits. We may refuse to honor any transaction for which you do not have sufficient

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available verified funds. The service will discontinue if no transaction is entered after numerous unsuccessful attempts to enter a transaction and there may be limits on the duration of each access.

The following limitations on Mobile Banking transactions may apply:

- There is no limit to the number of inquiries, transfers, or withdrawal requests you may make in any one (1) day.
- See Section 2 for transfer limitations that may apply to these transactions.
- **h. Bill Pay.** We will process bill payment transfer requests only to those creditors the Credit Union has designated in the User Instructions and such creditors as you authorize and for whom the Credit Union has the proper vendor code number. We will not process any bill payment transfer if the required transaction information is incomplete.

The Credit Union reserves the right to refuse to process any payment instructions that reasonably appear to the credit union to be fraudulent or erroneous. The Credit Union will withdraw the designated funds from your account and process your bill payment transfer by midnight of the business day following the date you make your payment request.

It is your responsibility to schedule your bill payments in such a manner that your obligations will be paid on time. You should enter and transmit your bill payment instructions at least ten (10) days before a bill is due. You are responsible for any late payments or finance charges that may be imposed as a result of your failure to transmit a timely payment authorization. We cannot guarantee the time that any payment will be credited to your account by any creditor and we not be liable for any refusal to accept payment, service fee, late charge, or finance charges you may incur. For any error or question you may have involving the billing statement of the creditor, you must contact the creditor directly. The Credit Union is not responsible for investigating such errors or questions.

You may cancel or stop payment on periodic bill payments and automatic, recurring bill payment instructions under certain circumstances. If you discover an error in or want to change a payment instruction (i.e. payment date or payment amount) for a periodic or automatic payment you have already scheduled for transmission

through the banking service, you may electronically edit or cancel your payment request through the Online Banking service four (4) business days before the payment due date. If your request is not timely entered, you will be responsible for the payment. If you wish to place an oral stop payment on an automotive, recurring bill payment transaction, not using the Online Banking Service, the Credit Union must receive your oral stop payment request at least three (3) business days before the next payment is scheduled to be made. You may call the Credit Union at the telephone number set forth in Section 5 to request a stop payment. If you call, the Credit Union may require you to confirm your stop payment request in writing within 14 days after the call.

If you have not used the Bill Pay Service for a period of six (6) consecutive months, we may deactivate your ability to access this service. In this case, you will need to contact the Credit Union to reactivate the service.

- There is no limit on the number of bill payments per day.
- The maximum amount of bill payments per vendor per day is \$99,999, if there are sufficient funds in your account.
- TRANSFER LIMITATIONS For all savings, Club, and Money Market accounts, you may make no more
 than six (6) transfers and withdrawals from your account to another account of yours or to a third party in
 any month by means of a preauthorized, automatic, or Internet transfer, by telephonic order or instruction,
 or by check, draft, debit card or similar order. If you exceed these limitations, your account may be subject
 to a fee or be closed.

2. CONDITIONS OF EFT SERVICES —

- a. Ownership of Cards. Any card or other device which we supply to you is our property and must be returned to us, or to any person whom we authorize to act as our agent, or to any person who is authorized to honor the card, immediately according to instructions. The card may be repossessed at any time at our sole discretion without demand or notice. You cannot transfer your card or account to another person.
- b. Honoring the Card. Neither we nor merchants authorized to honor the card will be responsible for the failure or refusal to honor the card or any other device we supply to you. If a merchant agrees to give you a refund or adjustment, you agree to accept a credit to your account in lieu of a cash refund.
- **Foreign Transactions. Visa.** Purchases and cash withdrawals made in foreign currencies will be debited from your account in U.S. dollars. The exchange rate between the transaction currency and the billing currency used for processing international transactions is a rate selected by Visa from a range of rates available in wholesale currency markets for the applicable central processing date, which rate may vary from the rate Visa itself receives or the government-mandated rate in effect for the applicable central processing date. The exchange rate used on the processing date may differ from the rate that would have been used on the purchase date or cardholder statement posting date. In addition, you will be assessed a fee for any card purchase or cash withdrawal involving a currency conversion. See our Truthin-Savings Disclosure for the current Foreign Currency Conversion Fee.

An International Service Assessment (ISA) fee will be assessed on the amount of the transaction, calculated in U.S. dollars, for all foreign transactions, including purchases, cash withdrawals and credits to your account. A foreign transaction is any transaction that you complete or a merchant completes on your card outside of the United States, with the exception of U.S. military bases, U.S. territories, U.S. embassies or U.S. consulates. See our Truth-in-Savings Disclosure for the current ISA fee.

d. Security of Access Code. You may use one (1) or more access codes with your electronic fund transfers. The access codes issued to you are for your security purposes. Any access codes issued to you are confidential and should not be disclosed to third parties or recorded on or with the card. You are responsible for safekeeping your access codes. You agree not to disclose or otherwise make your access codes available to anyone not authorized to sign on your accounts. If you authorize anyone to use your

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access codes, that authority shall continue until you specifically revoke such authority by notifying the Credit Union. You understand that any joint owner you authorize to use an access code may withdraw or transfer funds from any of your accounts. If you fail to maintain the security of these access codes and the Credit Union suffers a loss, we may terminate your EFT services immediately.

e. Joint Accounts. If any of your accounts accessed under this Agreement are joint accounts, all joint owners, including any authorized users, shall be bound by this Agreement and, alone and together, shall be responsible for all EFT transactions to or from any savings, checking, and Money Market or loan accounts as provided in this Agreement. Each joint account owner, without the consent of any other account owner, may, and is hereby authorized by every other joint account owner, make any transaction permitted under this Agreement. Each joint account owner is authorized to act for the other account owners, and the Credit Union may accept orders and instructions regarding any EFT transaction on any account from any joint account owner.

- 1. **FEES AND CHARGES** There are certain fees and charges for EFT services. For a current listing of all applicable fees, see our current Schedule of Fees and Charges that was provided to you at the time you applied for or requested these electronic services. From time to time, the charges may be changed. We will notify you of any changes as required by applicable law.
- 2. If you use an ATM not operated by us, you may be charged a fee by the ATM operator and by any national, regional, or local network used in processing the transaction (and you may be charged a fee for a balance inquiry even if you do not complete a funds transfer). The ATM surcharge will be debited from your account if you elect to complete the transaction or continue with the balance inquiry.
- 1. **MEMBER LIABILITY** You are responsible for all transactions you authorize using your EFT services under this Agreement. If you permit someone else to use an EFT service, your card or your access code, you are responsible for any transactions they authorize or conduct on any of your accounts.

TELL US AT ONCE if you believe your card or access code has been lost or stolen, if you believe someone has used your card or access code or otherwise accessed your accounts without your authority, or if you believe that an electronic fund transfer has been made without your permission using information from your check. Telephoning is the best way of keeping your possible losses down. You could lose all the money in your account (plus your maximum overdraft line-of-credit). If a transaction was made with your card or card number without your permission and was either a Visa or Interlink transaction, you will have no liability for the transaction, unless you were grossly negligent in the handling of your account or card or access code. For all other EFT transactions, including ATM transactions or if you were grossly negligent in the handling of your account or card or access code, your liability for an unauthorized transaction is determined as follows.

If you tell us within two (2) business days, after you learn the loss or theft of your card or access code, you can lose no more than \$50.00 if someone used your card or access code without your permission. If you do NOT tell us within two (2) business days after you learn of the loss or theft of your card or access code and we can prove we could have stopped someone from using your card or access code without your permission if you had told us, you could lose as much as \$500.00.

Also, if your statement shows transfers that you did not make including those made by card, access code or other means, TELL US AT ONCE. If you do not tell us within 60 days after the statement was mailed to you, you may not get back any money lost after the 60 days if we can prove that we could have stopped someone from making the transfers if you had told us in time. If a good reason (such as a hospital stay) kept you from telling us, we will extend the time periods.

If you believe your card or access code has been lost or stolen or that someone has transferred or may transfer money from your accounts without your permission, call:

You should also call the number or write to the address listed above if you believe a transfer has been made using the information from your check without your permission.

6. RIGHT TO RECEIVE DOCUMENTATION —

- a. Periodic Statements. Transfers and withdrawals made through any ATM or POS terminal, debit card transactions, audio response transactions, preauthorized EFTs, online/PC transactions, mobile access device transactions or bill payments you make will be recorded on your periodic statement. You will receive a statement monthly unless there is no transaction in a particular month. In any case, you will receive a statement at least quarterly.
- b. Terminal Receipt. You can get a receipt at the time you make any transaction (except inquiries) involving your account using an ATM and/or point-of-sale (POS) terminal.
- C. Direct Deposit. If you have arranged to have a direct deposit made to your account at least once every 60 days from the same source and you do not receive a receipt (such as a pay stub), you can find out whether or not the deposit has been made by calling

(503) 785-2528 or (800) 547-5532. This does not apply to transactions occurring outside the United States.

7. ACCOUNT INFORMATION DISCLOSURE — We will disclose information to third parties about your account or the transfers you make:

- As necessary to complete transfers;
- To verify the existence of sufficient funds to cover specific transactions upon the request of a third party, such as a credit bureau or merchant:
- If your account is eligible for emergency cash and/or emergency card replacement services and you request such services, you agree that we may provide personal information about you and your account that is necessary to provide you with the requested service(s):
- To comply with government agency or court orders; or
- If you give us your written permission.
- 1. **BUSINESS DAYS** Our business days are Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.
 - 1. **CREDIT UNION LIABILITY FOR FAILURE TO MAKE TRANSFERS** If we do not complete a transfer to or from your account on time or in the correct amount according to our agreement with you, we may be liable for your losses or damages. However, we will not be liable for direct or consequential damages in the following events:
 - If, through no fault of ours, there is not enough money in your accounts to complete the transaction, if any funds in your accounts necessary to complete the transaction are held as uncollected funds pursuant to our Funds Availability Policy Disclosure, or if the transaction involves a loan request exceeding your credit limit.
 - If you used your card or access code in an incorrect manner.
 - If the ATM where you are making the transfer does not have enough cash.
 - If the ATM was not working properly and you knew about the problem when you started the transaction.
 - If circumstances beyond our control (such as fire, flood, or power failure) prevent the transaction.
 - If the money in your account is subject to legal process or other claim.
 - If funds in your account are pledged as collateral or frozen because of a delinquent loan.
 - If the error was caused by a system of any participating ATM network.
 - If the electronic transfer is not completed as a result of your willful or negligent use of your card, access code, or any EFT facility for making such transfers.
 - If the telephone or computer equipment you use to conduct audio response, online/PC, or mobile access device transactions is not working properly and you know or should have known about the breakdown when you started the transaction.
 - If you have bill payment services, we can only confirm the amount, the participating merchant, and date of the bill payment transfer made by the Credit Union. For any other error or question you have involving the billing statement of the participating merchant, you must contact the merchant directly. We are not responsible for investigating such errors.
 - Any other exceptions as established by the Credit Union.
- 2. NOTICES All notices from us will be effective when we have mailed them or delivered them to the appropriate address in the Credit Union's records. Notices from you will be effective when received by the Credit Union at the address specified in this Agreement. We reserve the right to change the terms and conditions upon which this service is offered. We will mail notice to you at least 21 days before the effective date of any change. Use of this service is subject to existing regulations governing the Credit Union account and any future changes to those regulations.

The following information is a list of safety precautions regarding the use of ATMs and night deposit facilities:

- Be aware of your surroundings, particularly at night.
- Consider having someone accompany you when the ATM or night deposit facility is used after dark.
- Close the entry door of any ATM facility equipped with a door.
- If another person is uncomfortably close to you at the time of your transaction, ask the person to step back

before you complete your transaction. If it is after the regular hours of the financial institution and you are using an ATM, do not permit entrance to any person you do not know.

- Refrain from displaying your cash at the ATM or night deposit facility. As soon as your transaction is completed, place your money in your purse or wallet. Count the cash later in the safety of your car or home.
- If you notice anything suspicious at the ATM or night deposit facility, consider using another ATM or night
 deposit facility or coming back later. If you are in the middle of a transaction and you notice something
 suspicious, cancel the transaction, take your card or deposit envelope, and leave.
- If you are followed after making a transaction, go to the nearest public area where people are located.
- Do not write your personal identification number (PIN) or access code on your ATM card.
- Report all crimes to law enforcement officials immediately. If emergency assistance is needed, call the
 police from the nearest available public telephone.
- **11. BILLING ERRORS** In case of errors or questions about electronic fund transfers from your savings, checking, and Money Market accounts or if you need more information about a transfer on the statement or receipt, telephone us at the following number or send us a written notice to the following address as soon as you can. We must hear from you no later than 60 days after we sent the first statement on which the problem appears. Call us at:

- Tell us your name and account number.
- Describe the electronic transfer you are unsure about and explain, as clearly as you can, why you believe the Credit Union has made an error or why you need more information.
- Tell us the dollar amount of the suspected error.

If you tell us orally, we may require that you send us your complaint or question in writing within ten (10) business days.

We will determine whether an error has occurred within ten (10)* business days after we hear from you and will correct any error promptly. If we need more time, however, we may take up to 45** days to investigate your complaint or question. If we decide to do this, we will credit your account within ten (10)* business days for the amount you think is in error so that you will have the use of the money during the time it takes us to complete our investigation. If we ask you to put your complaint or question in writing and we do not receive it within ten (10) business days, we may not credit your account.

We will tell you the results within three (3) business days after completing our investigation. If we decide that there was no error, we will send you a written explanation. You may ask for copies of the documents that we used in our investigation.

- * If you give notice of an error within 30 days after you make the first deposit to your account, we will have 20 business days instead of ten (10) business days to investigate the error.
- ** If you give notice of an error within 30 days after you make the first deposit to your account, notice of an error involving a point-ofsale (POS) transaction, or notice of an error involving a transaction initiated outside the U.S., its possessions and territories, we will have 90 days instead of 45 days to investigate the error.

NOTE: If the error you assert is an unauthorized Visa transaction, other than a cash disbursement at an ATM, we will credit your account within five (5) business days unless we determine that the circumstances or your account history warrant a delay, in which case you will receive credit within ten (10) business days.

1. **TERMINATION OF EFT SERVICES** — You may terminate this Agreement or any EFT service under this Agreement at any time by notifying us in writing and stopping your use of your card and any access code. You must return all cards to the Credit Union. You also agree to notify any participating merchants that authority to make bill payment transfers has been revoked. We may also terminate this Agreement at any time by notifying you orally or in writing. If we terminate this Agreement, we may notify any participating merchants making preauthorized debits or credits to any of your accounts that this Agreement has been terminated and that we will not accept any further preauthorized transaction instructions. We may also program our computer not to accept your card or access code for any EFT service. Whether you or the Credit Union terminates this Agreement the termination shall not affect your obligations under this

Agreement for any electronic transactions made prior to termination.

- 2. **GOVERNING LAW** This Agreement is governed by the bylaws of the Credit Union, federal laws and regulations, the laws and regulations of the state of Oregon, and local clearinghouse rules, as amended from time to time. Any disputes regarding this Agreement shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the court of the county in which the Credit Union is located.
- 3. ENFORCEMENT You are liable to us for any losses, costs or expenses we incur resulting from your failure to follow this Agreement. You authorize us to deduct any such losses, costs or expenses from your account without prior notice to you. If we bring a legal action to collect any amount due under or to enforce this Agreement, we shall be entitled, subject to applicable law, to payment of reasonable attorney's fees and costs, including fees on any appeal, bankruptcy proceedings, and any postjudgment collection actions.

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
