WHAT DOES American Midwest Bank DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. The information can include:

- Social Security Number and Income
- Account balances and Payment historyCredit history and Credit Scores

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

How?

All financial companies need to share **customers**' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their **customers**' personal information; the reasons **American Midwest Bank** chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. • American Midwest Bank does not share with our affiliates.
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial. Nonaffiliates that we share with can include insurance companies, mortgage companies and direct marketing companies.
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. • Our joint marketing partners include insurance companies.
