FACTS	WHAT DOES FIRST MINNETONKA CITY BANK DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: Social Security number Income Assets Account Balances Account Transaction History Credit History When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.
How?	All financial companies need to share your personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below we list the reasons financial companies can share their personal information; the reasons First Minnetonka City Bank chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

How does First Minnetonka City Bank protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only: • sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness • affiliates from using your information to market to you • sharing for non-affiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.	

Definitions		
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. First Minnetonka City Bank has no affiliates	
Non-affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. First Minnetonka City Bank does not share with non-affiliates so they can market to you	
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between non-affiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. First Minnetonka City Bank does not have any joint marketing agreements that involve sharing customer information.
