What We Do: How does lowa State Bank & Trust protect my personal information? To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does lowa State Bank & Trust collect my personal information? We collect your personal information, for example, when you open an account, make deposits or withdrawals from your account, pay your bills, apply for a loan, or use your debit card. We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing? Federal law gives you the right to limit only: sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes-information about your creditworthiness; affiliates from using your information to market to you; and sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you. State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

Definitions:

Affiliates: Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Iowa State Bank does not share with our affiliates.
