Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do. What? The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and income
- Account balances and payment history
- Credit history and credit scores

When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

Joint Marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. The Johnson State Bank and Bank of Ulysses does not have any joi marketing agreements.
