HOW?

How does PARK RIDGE COMMUNITY BANK protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

We restrict access to non public personal information to those employees who need to know that information to provide the product of service.

How does PARK RIDGE COMMUNITY BANK collect my personal information

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- · deposit money or open an account
- apply for a loan or make a wire transfer
