



FACTS	WHAT DOES PRIVATE BANK MINNESOTA DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Social Security number and Account balances Account transactions and Credit history Payment history and Transaction history <p>When you are no longer our customer, We continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Private Bank Minnesota chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Reasons we can share your personal information	Does Private Bank Minnesota share?	Can you limit this sharing?
For our everyday business purposes —such as to process your transactions, maintain your account(s), respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus	Yes	No

What we do	
How does Private Bank Minnesota protect my personal information	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> apply for a loan or give us your contact information give us your income information or open an account provide account information
How does Private Bank Minnesota collect my personal information	<p>We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.</p> <p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> sharing for affiliates/ everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness affiliates from using your information to market to you sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you
Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

Definitions

Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Private Bank Minnesota does not share with our affiliates.
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Private Bank Minnesota does not share with our affiliates.
Joint marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Private Bank Minnesota doesn't jointly market.
