



## Privacy Policy

**FACTS** WHAT DOES STAMFORD FEDERAL CREDIT UNION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

**Why?** Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

**What?** The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- ▶ Social Security number and account balances
- ▶ credit card or other debt and credit history
- ▶ overdraft history and payment history

When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

**How?** All financial companies need to share members' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their members' personal information; the reasons Stamford Federal Credit Union chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

<b>For our nonaffiliates to market to you</b>	No	We don't share

#### What we do

**How does Stamford Federal Credit Union protect my personal information?**

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

**How does Stamford Federal Credit Union collect my personal information?**

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- ▶ open an account or apply for a loan
- ▶ apply for insurance or provide account information
- ▶ give us your contact information

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

**Why can't I limit all sharing?**

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- ▶ sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes - information about your creditworthiness
- ▶ affiliates from using your information to market to you
- ▶ sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State law and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

#### Definitions

**Affiliates**

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- ▶ Stamford Federal Credit Union does not share with our affiliates

**Nonaffiliates**

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- ▶ Nonaffiliates we share with can include insurance companies, government agencies, plastic card processors (credit/debit/ATM), financial statement publishers or printers, mailhouse, mortgage companies, mortgage service companies, consumer reporting agencies, data processors, check/share draft printers, and direct marketing companies

**Joint Marketing**

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- ▶ Our joint marketing partners include CUNA Mutual Group's MEMBERCONNECT and credit card companies
