WHAT DOES The Cape Cod Five Cents Savings Bank DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Social Security number ■ income ■ payment history ■ account balances ■ account transactions ■ credit history <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customer's personal information; the reasons the Cape Cod Five chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Reasons we can share your personal information	Does The Cape Cod Five share?	Can you limit this sharing?
For our everyday business purposes— such as to process your transactions, maintain your account(s), respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus	Yes	No

What we do

<p>How does Cape Cod Five protect my personal information?</p>	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p>We continually assess, upgrade and install new technology to protect your information.</p>
<p>How does Cape Cod Five collect my personal information?</p>	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ open an account ■ pay your bills ■ make deposits or withdrawals from your account ■ deposit money ■ apply for a loan <p>We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates or other companies.</p>
<p>Why can't I limit all sharing?</p>	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness ■ affiliates from using your information to market to you ■ sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.</p>

Definitions

<p>Affiliates</p>	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ <i>The Cape Cod Five Cents Savings Bank has no affiliates.</i>
<p>Nonaffiliates</p>	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ <i>The Cape Cod Five Cents Savings Bank does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market you.</i>
<p>Joint marketing</p>	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ <i>The Cape Cod Five Cents Savings Bank does not jointly market.</i>

Other important information

The Cape Cod Five complies with Massachusetts Regulation 201 CMR 17.00 that insures the security and confidentiality of customer information in a manner fully consistent with industry standards; protects against anticipated threats of hazards to the security or integrity of such information and protects against unauthorized access to or use of such information.
