### FACTS:

What does First National Bank of Absecon do with your personal information?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

### WHAT?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include

- · Social Security number and income
- · Account balances and payment history
- Credit history and credit scores

When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

### HOW?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons First National Bank of Absecon chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

# What We Do

How does First National Bank of Absecon protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does First National Bank of Absecon collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- · Open an account or deposit money
- Pay your bills or apply for a loan
- · Use your credit or debit card

We also collect your personal information from others such as credit bureaus.

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes information about your creditworthiness
- Affiliates from using your information to market to you
- · Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you.

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

### **Definitions**

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Affiliates

▶First National Bank of Absecon does not share with our affiliates.

Nonaffiliates Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be

financial and nonfinancial companies.

First National Bank of Absecon does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. Joint marketing

▶First National Bank of Absecon does not jointly market.

### Other Important Information

For New Jersey Customers. We will not share personal information from deposit or share relationships with nonaffiliates either for them to market to you or for joint marketing—without your authorization.
