FACTS	WHAT DOES FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF HARTFORD DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?	
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.	
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ social security number and income ▶ account balance and payment history ▶ transaction history and credit history <p>When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>	
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons First National Bank of Hartford chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes-information about your creditworthiness ▶ affiliates from using your information to market to you ▶ sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>
What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?	Your choices will apply to everyone on your account.

Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ FNB Hartford Investment Services ▶ FNB Hartford Insurance Services, Inc.
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p>
Joint marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Financial Marketing Corporation ▶ Elan
