Affiliates		Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies.
		• Our affiliates include companies with the Scott County State Bank name; and nonfinancial companies such as Community Bank Shares of Indiana, Inc, which is bank holding company that owns The Scott County State Bank and Your Community Bank.
Nonaffiliates		Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies.
		<ul> <li>The Scott County State Bank may share information with nonaffiliated third parties such as mortgage companies, insurance companies, direct marketing companies, nonprofit organizations or its credit card issuer First Bank Card.</li> </ul>
Joint Marketing		A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.
